New Haven, CT: The Ely Center of Contemporary Art announces two new

online exhibits, What Now? and Your Pet Here.

The Ely Center of Contemporary Art (ECOCA) introduces two new online exhibitions -- in a nimble response to the current global Covid-19 "stay at home" executive order -- that allow for artists and non-artists alike to participate and connect to one another. These virtual shows aim to expand opportunities for artists and the public to engage with urgent issues, ideas and innovations. We aim to amplify as many voices as possible during this time of solidarity and community.

ECOCA has maintained *Digital Grace* an active, monthly-rotating curated online gallery for the past four years and is expanding this platform in response to the current, urgent need for social, cultural, intellectual, and creative connectivity during this time of physical distancing and isolation.

What Now? is an online exhibition that presents global community responses to the current global health crisis. The exhibit asks: What do we do now? How is the current health crisis affecting you, and what does the future look like? Novels such as *Brave New World*, *Handmaid's Tale, Fahrenheit 451* and 1984 describe surreal and dystopian futures that now seem eerily real, so what is the new normal? What Now?
